

District 28AAA Volleyball Rules
2017

DISTRICT SECRETARY: Bryan Blanar, Boling ISD

1. ADMISSION CHARGES TO DISTRICT 28AAA GAMES
Adults \$3 Students \$2 High School and Junior High Matches

2. OFFICIALS:

There will be two certified neutral officials for the varsity games. If two certified neutral officials cannot be secured, then the game will be rescheduled at the opponent's home court at the next playing date available. The opposing coach should be notified regarding the officials seven days prior to the match, when possible.

3. DISTRICT PLAY: DOUBLE ROUND ROBIN

High school teams will play each other twice. The home team must notify the District Chairman if a game is changed.

4. RALLY SCORING

Follow Rally Scoring Format as provided by UIL. Sub-varsity teams will play 2 out of 3 to 25 (cap at 30), with the third game being played to 25 (cap to 30).

5. SCORE TABLE

The official scorekeeper must be an adult approved by the home school. A trained manager/student may keep the clock and/or operate the scoreboard. Students may call lines for all games (varsity included).

6. GAME TIMES

On Tuesdays, Freshman, Junior Varsity and Varsity teams will play at the same site, beginning at 5:00pm. Upon mutual agreement of both coaches the Freshman and Junior Varsity could play in split gyms at 5pm due to distance between schools. On Fridays the Varsity games will start

at 5:00pm followed by the Junior Varsity and Freshman. Friday district Volleyball games can be moved to Saturday's by mutual agreement between schools.

Junior High schools will play on Mondays, beginning at 5pm in the following order: 7B, 8B, 7A, 8A.

B teams – 2 sets to 25 cap at 30 A teams – 2 out of 3 to 25 cap at 30
If necessary game 3 will be played to 15.

“A” Team, if a third game is played the rally scoring is to 15 with a cap of 20

Warm up times for Junior High are 3 minutes warm up, 3 minutes hitting per team, 2 minutes serving. Sub Varsity warm up are 4,3,3,2. Varsity warm up times are 5,5,5,2. Game times may be changed by mutual consent of both schools.

7. BALL

UIL approved volleyball. Home teams will provide warm up balls for visiting teams at all junior high, sub varsity, and varsity matches.

8. DISTRICT GAME RESULTS

The HOME TEAM will text (979) 531-9721 or email the game results to the Executive Secretary bblanar@bolingisd.net IMMEDIATELY after each game or by 9 AM the next day.

9. ALL DISTRICT TEAM

The first week after Volleyball district competition has been completed; the District Champion will be responsible for calling a meeting of the Girls varsity Volleyball coaches who will select players for the All-District team. Results of the All-District selections are to be sealed and kept by the district school's coach until after teams representing the district are out of the play-offs. The meeting date will be November 1, 2017. Time will be arranged by the district champion.

An All-Academic Team shall be made up of students that have a 90 or better average by the student athlete during the first grading period of the year.

An All District Team will be selected using the following as a guideline: The All District Team shall have a maximum of six and a minimum of five superlative awards that are nominated from the first, second and third place teams (MVP, Outstanding Setter, Hitter, Defense, Newcomer, Libero, etc). There shall be a 1st Team of no more than eight and no less than five players from the district. There will also be a 2nd Team of no more than eight and no less than five players from the district. The coaches from the district will determine how to count ties and Honorable Mention Honors at the district meeting. The coaches may choose to make changes to these recommendations at the meeting.

10. DETERMIING THE DISTRICT WINNER AND RUNNER UP:

The District Champion shall be determined by playing a double round robin schedule.

- a. The team with the best overall win/loss record will be the District Champion.
- b. The team with the 2nd best win/loss record will be the 2nd place team.
- c. The team with the 3rd best win/loss record will be the 3rd place team.
- d. The team with the 4th best win/loss record will be the 4th place team.

In the event two (2) or more teams tie for the District Championship, they will be declared Co-Champions and the following (head to head) format to determine playoff seeding.

In the event of any tie the first tie breaker is head to head and if head to head cannot resolve the tie then a playoff game or tournament is played. Head to head is defined as the record between the tied schools during district play. (not overall record)

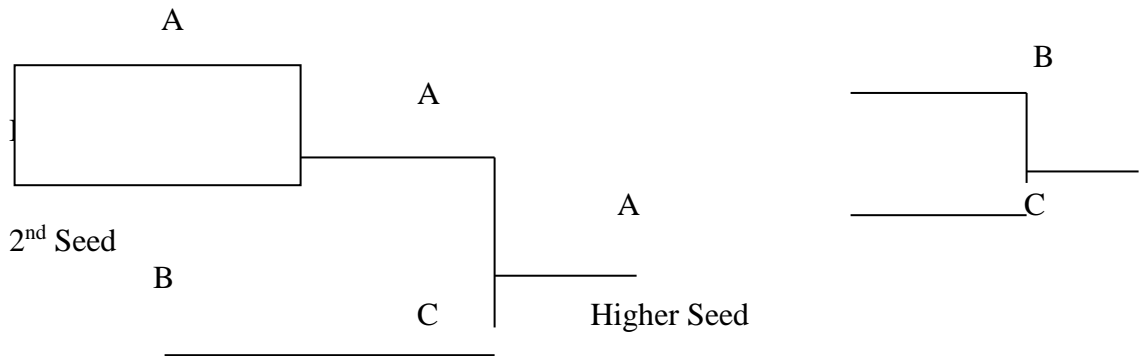
Two Teams Tie: (head to head)

- a. If one team has defeated the other team twice in round robin play that team will occupy the higher playoff seeding with the other team occupying the next available position (no game needed).
- b. If the two (2) teams involved each have a win over each other (split) in the round robin play they have the following options.

1. A one game playoff with the winner occupying the higher playoff seeding and the other team occupying the next available position. If either team chooses to play the game, the game must be played.
 2. Schools involved may flip for playoff positions. Teams tied for third place position cannot flip and must play a one game playoff for that position.
- c. In the event three (3) teams tie for the District Championship, teams will be declared Co-Champions and a playoff seeding tournament will be played. Three teams will advance to the playoffs.

For the runner up and third place position, all teams involved in the tie will participate in a playoff seeding tournament, with the winner occupying the higher playoff seeding and the runner up team occupying the next available position.

- Seeding for the playoff tournament will be decided through a coin flip. No team involved will receive any special seeding privileges.
- The teams involved in the tie will flip a coin, odd team will get the bye and the two other teams will play. The winner will play the team with the bye to determine the higher seeding.
- If the team with the bye loses, it will play an additional game with the first round loser to determine the next playoff seed only.



- a. Four or more teams tie: The teams involved will draw for position A, B, C, D, etc and play a tournament to determine the District Champion. Winners of the first games will play for the District Championship and 2nd place.

11. JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL

Round Robin Schedule will be played on Mondays. A schedule will be provided. The following year, the Junior High Volleyball schedule will remain the same with the exception of flipping the sites.

12. SECURITY

Home team will provide; left to the discretion of the home team.

13. MUSIC

The home school may play warm up music. The home school will control the volume and content of the music being played as determined by the administrator in charge.

14. FILMS/TAPE

Filming of the match is only allowed by the two participating schools. Any other video taping must be approved by the home schools administrator in charge and both coaches. UIL does not allow flash photography. School will not share films or tapes in any manner after district play with any other teams except by consent of the teams involved in the playoffs.
